Bowel cancer claims the lives of 103 Australians every week (5,354 people a year), but it is one of the most treatable types of cancer when detected early.

While the risk of bowel cancer increases with age, it can affect people of all ages.


Red Apple Day (Wednesday, 21st June 2023) is Bowel Cancer Australia's Annual Giving Day.
